**ROCK SWAP – 28<sup>th</sup> & 29<sup>th</sup> March 2009- REGISTRATION**

Thank you for registering your interest in our Rock Swap.

We had sixty four tailgaters on the Saturday last year, and the crowds were quite good NO RAIN Ah, the joys of tailgating! The Farmers' Market that now takes place every Saturday morning in pavilions only a couple of hundred metres from our site brings in hordes of people. Be prepared for them to turn up from 8am!

As previously, we have reserved fifty sites in the camping area, and all are powered, though unpowered sites are available. **Pets are permitted (and welcome!).** There is some adjoining space for those who want to tailgate, but not camp. We can get some more space if necessary.

Regrettably, EPIC has increased the unpowered camping fees this year. We have no option but to pass on the increase. .

A local caravan rental company is offering 2- to 6-berth vans for hire, and they will put them on site. If you want to hire a van, please contact B & V Van Hire directly. Unfortunately, hirers at other events have vandalised the vans, stolen fittings or left them like pig sties, so the owners have had to crack down. Contact details are at the bottom of this letter. We will also have 2.4 metre tables for hire for those who may be unable to bring their own. **As was the case last year we now have to pay for the full weekend for all tables delivered to our site, so we will only order enough for those who reserve them. There will be no spares.**

The emphasis is on having a fun event with a minimum of administrative interference. Hence there are no restrictions on selling times and no space restrictions for those who have camp sites, provided that they stay within their site boundaries. You may need to move your vehicle out of the way when you are selling. Selling to dealers and other tailgaters on the Friday is quite OK.

**PLEASE NOTE!**

**If you want your "usual" site, we MUST HAVE your REGISTRATION AND PAYMENT by COB on Friday 13th March 2009**

Advance registration will help to minimise the chaos at the time, but we hope to be able to accommodate those who make a last minute decision to attend. You WILL NOT get a preferred site in this case. And, if we are booked out, or "your" site has been allocated to someone else, so be it. Day sellers can also take as much space as they want for the flat fee.

Entry is free for the public. So far, several other events have been booked for the weekend at EPIC, and these will help to bring in the public.

EPIC is only a couple of minutes drive from the Dickson shopping centre which trades seven days a week. In addition to Woollies and the usual array of specialty shops Dickson is the home of Canberra's Chinatown with an excellent selection of restaurants - Asian, Middle East and whatever, not to mention Maccas and The Colonel. EPIC is also close to several motels and guest houses. For more information on these, please contact the Canberra Visitors' Centre. Contact details are also at the foot of this letter.

All the major attractions of the National Capital, such as the War Memorial, National Gallery, National Museum, Old and New Parliament Houses etc are within about fifteen minutes drive of EPIC. We can cater for people who want to arrive early or stay on after the Rock Swap. Cost will be \$25 per day powered, \$17 unpowered.

The social events – the Banger Barbie on Friday and a pizza night on Saturday will be on again this year. The Banger Barby will kick off at 6pm on Friday evening. For two dollars we will provide two bangers, sauce and onions in two slices of bread. Kids' half serves for \$1. BYO chairs, drinks and salad. We will take orders and money for the pizza party during the day on Saturday, and have them delivered at about 6.30pm, or whatever other time suits the majority.

The 4-burner gas BBQ, roughly 90cm x 60cm will be available for use at all times other than cooking time on Friday night. A small donation towards the cost of gas will be appreciated.
